As you read this I will be on holiday on the Isle of Skye. I will have spent three days getting here and past many landscapes along the way. Travelling first to Yorkshire to stay overnight with my cousin, before an early start the next morning to travel to Blair Athol for another overnight stay and a visit to the House of Bruar for some retail therapy! And finally, the last leg, 'over the sea to Skye'. The contrast of scenery is amazing, but the best was when we arrived at the cottage that overlooks the Isle of Rothesay, just south of Portree. From here we see the occasional pod of dolphins or if we are lucky whales.
