# Community:

## Bishop Nigel writes...

Generosity is a fine attribute. People who are stingy with money sadden me. It's not how little or much money we have, but how we use it. Jesus' poignant parable of the Widow's Mite re-states the Jewish principle of First to the Lord. We give to God first simply because we are loved and blessed. I met a farmer once who reckoned the Church of England was badly run. "I tally my profit at the end of the year and perhaps give something to the parish church, but nothing if I make a loss" (or, I suspect, if he didn't like the Vicar). His approach was last to the Lord. Contrast that with Christians who tythe, i.e. give 10% of their income. It is reckoned that if most Church of England churchgoers gave 5% of disposable income it would be considerably enabled.

Each April sees the end of the Tax Year. Advisers navigate clients through the HMRC rules and returns. The great news however is that Gift Aid Charity donations reduce personal tax while adding 25% to the recipient. For example, every  $\pounds$  given to All Saints Nettleham becomes  $\pounds$ 1.25 - which really adds up with plenty of givers. To talk confidentially about ways of giving please contact our Church Treasurer Simon Hardy, or one of the clergy.

All Saints deserves our support. Its mission and ministry are faithful, caring and engaging. The varied worship and outreach are growing. People of all ages in Nettleham and beyond come because we address their needs and interests. We are also guardians of a medieval Grade I Listed Building of historic significance. We recall the pre-Covid emergency repairs – however, securing the fabric of the church tower and bells is now a critical and costly project which cannot be delayed any longer. Once this is sorted, we can maybe consider our community facilities. The project is certainly daunting but do-able if we believe in First to the Lord. Our Parish Priest and PCC will in due course outline plans and the challenge for our congregation, and the village who have previously supported All Saints generously.

So, I leave the last word to St Matthew, the reformed tax gatherer, who understood Jesus' inspiring words: "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also".
