#### Bishop Nigel writes...

Recently Anne and I celebrated our 43rd Wedding Anniversary – where do the years go? All of us have anniversaries, many happy but maybe some not so good to remember. We keep diaries, noting occasions coming up. The Church's Liturgical Calendar follows the times and seasons of the year, saints' days and festivals. In Nettleham each week we recall the faithful departed on their 'years mind', the anniversary of our loved ones passing.

Anniversaries and remembering link us to our family and community past. Ancestry is very popular, searching back to where we come from. I have so far traced my Cambridgeshire Peyton family tree back nine generations to the early 1700s. My mother's family may well have European Jewish roots and I am keen to find out more.

Parish churches too have ancestry. With so much heritage in England we are blessed with atmospheric buildings like ours, dating back to medieval and Saxon times. All Saints Nettleham, sister of our nearby Cathedral, has lived through wars, plagues, economic ups and downs, the industrial revolution and medical advances. The digital leap, Covid and challenge of climate change and artificial intelligence. On 4 July the UK will mark a General Election. I shall vote but more personally reflect on the anniversary of my Ordination in 1976.

The inspirational truth is that there has been a continuous congregation here in All Saints Nettleham for centuries. Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals are called Rites of Passage because they mark arrivals, unions, and departures through the passage of time. Our anniversaries and hopes accompany us through daily life. We are not alone. We are neither the only beginning nor the only end. We are carried on the shoulders of the faithful. We are reassured that all their prayers are soaked into the walls of the church, to which we add our own. As we worship here week by week remember that we are nothing less than the community of saints' past, present – and future. And above all, we live in God's time.
