# Bishop Nigel writes...

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, Jesus reigning in glory - a fitting crown to the Christian Year, before we join the Advent journey to Christmas. The Feast was introduced by Pope Pius XI in 1925 amidst political tensions in Europe. In that year Mussolini became the fascist dictator of Italy, basking in popular adoration as II Duce, the 'Duke'. Individuals still crave power, and today we see dangers lurking across the world. Astutely, the Pope felt it urgent to remind people of the ultimate reign of God.

Christ the King celebrates the all-embracing authority of Christ, drawing earth and heaven into his dominion. We are members of Christ's body the Church, gathered into the Kingdom. We are drawn into a deeper life of worship and discipleship. At the time, Pope Pius stressed his ambition that the feast should remind ordinary Christians that Christ has dominion over our daily lives - reigning over our minds, our wills, and our hearts. Kingdom values are expressed in kindness and concern for others. Feeding the hungry and thirsty, clothing the naked, caring for the sick, visiting prisoners. It is the outworking of Jesus' teaching – those stories ending with Jesus quizzing his hearers: so, who behaved well? Who was rewarded? Then challenging us, 'go then and do likewise'. The kingdom of heaven requires faithful participants not spectators. So, this week we join with each other, re-committing ourselves to joyful service, not just admiring the kingdom from afar – but living it here and now.

Stir up, O Lord, the wills of your faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may by you be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
