### Lucille writes...

Last weekend Nettleham Green was transformed as the Christmas lights were switched on. The view from my front windows went from dark and gloomy to a glorious spectacle of fairy lights. The sight of these decorations lifts my mood and makes me smile every time I catch sight of them.

The tradition of lighting up our shops and houses at Christmas seems to have been copied from the United States but I noticed it particularly when we visited Lapland a couple of years ago. I was expecting my first glimpses of the scenery to be expanses of dark forests but I was astonished to see sparkling lights showing up even in quite remote places. Every building and many of the trees seemed to have been festooned with lights. In the Arctic, where even the days are dark, the people have learned the importance of light to the human spirit.

Of course, for Christians, the lights at this time of year are a symbol and a reminder of what we are preparing for: the birth of Christ, born to be the saviour and the light to the world, Christ who is the light that dispels the darkness of sin. More than anything, this is the beacon of hope that shines out in the darkness of our world. Furthermore, we, who have Christ in our lives, can reflect this light as we take God's message of love and redemption to all people.
