Growing Faith:

Insurance: When you're next looking to renew your house and contents insurance please have a look at what Ecclesiastical Insurance, our Church's insurers, could offer. If they are competitive and you decide to buy a policy from them they will, as long as you ask, give our Church $\pounds 130$. Might be worth a look.

FiSH Update: Many thanks to all of you who contributed to our FiSH (Food in School Holidays) appeal. At the eleventh hour the government/local authority stepped in and provided families with a ± 100 voucher for each child entitled to free school meals; these were distributed by the schools. We consulted the schools and have agreed that, as the families in the greatest need had been provided for, we would save the donated monies for distribution in 2025. The fact that 55 children were identified by the schools as being eligible for free school meals just goes to show that, even in a relatively affluent place like Nettleham, there is still a considerable level of un-met need.
