Bishop Nigel writes...

Candlemas which we keep this week celebrates young and old. Jesus' arrival at the Temple in Jerusalem was common practice for parents presenting their new-born to God. The post-natal cleansing ritual of Mary seems patriarchal nowadays but recognises the dangers of childbirth to mother and baby, highlighted these days in enquiries into NHS maternity care.

However, this baby is the long-awaited Messiah, 'a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for the glory of God's people Israel'. Like a candle shining through the darkness. The Presentation of Christ in the Temple, the Purification of the Virgin Mary, Candlemas. One Christian celebration with three names and meanings, woven into a beautiful story by St Luke.

What of the other characters? Anna and Simeon, two devout elderly individuals, often to be found in God's house, saying their prayers. Whilst new life's arrivals are greeted with joy, dreaming their baby dreams, those of a certain vintage ponder memories, awaiting their departure.

Old age was revered in Bible times as a special blessing. Indeed, Luke begins with the miraculous pregnancy of Mary's older relative Elizabeth. Anna and Simeon are portrayed with similar reverence. Simeon hoped to witness the arrival of the Messiah, and in Jesus recognised the destiny of salvation. Anna, a woman of deep insight, also saw in Jesus the redemption of Jerusalem. Not for the first, nor last time, Mary and Joseph are given much to ponder. Simeon and Anna witness the fulfilment of Old Testament hopes, figures who herald the arrival of the new Christian era. Individuals finally at peace with God and themselves. Like the joy and sense of regeneration felt by grandparents.

In my former Scottish diocese, St Mary's Arbroath has a stained-glass window depicting the story of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. Elderly Simeon lovingly enfolds Jesus in his arms, blessing the child, watched by his adoring parents Mary and Joseph. Two pigeons peck away on the ground. Anna's and Simeon's eyes are smiling with adoration and relief. Light, glory and salvation have come at last to fulfil God's promise for humankind. No more waiting on God, just time to shuffle offstage, to 'depart in peace'.
