We have exciting news! A new administrator has been appointed to the Lawres Local Mission Partnership. The name of the person who will be taking up the role is Suzanne Maple. The administrator role will focus on the administration of baptisms, weddings and funerals for the 27 churches in our area. They will also offer support with DBS ID checking.

Revd Penny Green, our Rural Dean, will have the responsibility for the daily tasks for the new administrator and Revd Michelle will be the link between the administrator and Nettleham PCC, who are the employer. ## Weekly Prayer

It helps, now and then, to step back and take the long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts; it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work.

Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying that the kingdom always lies beyond us. No statement says all that could be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith. No confession brings perfection. No pastoral visit brings wholeness. No program accomplishes the church's mission. No set of goals and objectives includes everything. This is what we are about.

We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water the seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces effects far beyond our capabilities. We cannot do everything and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs.
