He is buried in the churchyard as is Bishop Christopher Wordsworth (nephew of the William Wordsworth the famous poet) whose hymns were perhaps first sung in Riseholme. There will be cakes and refreshments, a second-hand book stall, plant sale, artisan crafts, a wool spinning demonstration, a display of patchwork quilts, a talk on the history of the church at 1.30pm each day and an organ recital!

**Lifted in Love, Sent with Grace** (Acts 1:1–11, Psalm 47, Ephesians 1:17–23, Luke 24:46–53)

This week, as the Church celebrates Ascension Day, we find ourselves gazing upward with the disciples, hearts full of awe and minds filled with questions. In Acts, we witness Jesus taken up before their eyes, a moment both majestic and mysterious. Luke's Gospel tells us they returned to Jerusalem "*with great joy*," not with sadness but with trust in what was to come. That has been echoed in my own heart recently. As I prepare to move on to serve my curacy in All Saints Church: Swinderby, I want to take this opportunity to say a deeply felt *thank you* to each and every one of you in Nettleham.

Over the last three years as an ordinand, you have welcomed me, encouraged me, taught me so much and helped shape me. You have been patient teachers, faithful pray-ers, kind companions, and you have made me feel at home. I've learnt so much from all of you: through worship and shared cups of tea, meetings and Christmas crafts, prayers whispered and laughter shared. You have helped me discover what ministry looks like, not just in theory, but in community. For that, I will always be grateful.

As I reflect on this week's Ephesians reading, Paul's prayer resonates deeply: "*That you may know the hope to which He has called you, the riches of His glorious inheritance in His holy people.*" That hope and richness has been tangible here. You have shown me what it means to be Christ's body, hands and feet in action, with hearts full of grace. Thank you for encouraging me, for forgiving my stumbles, and for often lifting me up when I fell down.

As I leave, I carry your love and support with me. I know that without the grounding I received at Nettleham, I would not feel ready for the next part of this journey. However, just like the disciples at the Ascension, I leave not with loss but with joy, because I have been sent, and I have been prepared.

Psalm 47 reminds us to "*Sing praises to God, sing praises!*" So let's keep doing just that, praising the One who lifts us, sends us, and never leaves us. And if you're ever passing through Swinderby or Witham St Hughs, the kettle will be on and the biscuits ready. With love and gratitude, Yola
