Bíshop Nígel wrítes...

Friday 4 July marked the 49th anniversary of my Ordination as a Deacon in St Paul's Cathedral Dundee in 1976. A year later, on 6 November I was Ordained as a Priest. Thirty-five years later, on 8 October 2011 my Consecration as a Bishop took place in the same Cathedral. Clergy are mindful of our milestones as God is never quite finished with us.

We are all aware of anniversaries – especially births, marriages, and deaths. Some anniversaries are joyful, and we mark them with cards and family celebrations. Others are sad and remembered in our hearts. All these dates are lodged in our brains and diaries.

Youngsters are keen to add another year as they grow up, marking big steps with graduating ceremonies. Our grandson Sam had one (yes!) when he moved from Nursery to Infant School. Moving to Secondary School is a particularly significant moment and will soon arrive for our Nettleham Junior School Year 6. This year our grandchildren Tamsin 18 and Harry 16 will be enjoying 'Prom Glam' (not cheap) and I daresay a bit of anarchy. Finally, there are College and University Graduations and the launch into adult working life and its responsibilities.

The Church Calendar marks the seasons and saints' days. Parish Churches celebrate their dedication: we have All Saints Day each year on I November. Our Cathedral celebrates Bishop Hugh of Lincoln who died on 17 November 1200 with a special day and Choral Evensong. Historically, this year marks the 1700th anniversary of the Nicene Creed written in 325, the foundational statement of the Christian belief in God the Father, Jesus Christ the Son and the Holy Spirit. We recite it each Sunday in the Parish Communion.
