Revd Thomas writes...

Once upon a time I tried to do a piece of work on the idea of melismatic singing, the Jubilus theme of Ephesians 5:19 "sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts" and the emotional effervescence people feel in the process of singing from the depths of their being in praise of God (a form of Charismatic Pentecostalism). Just recently I've had another look at St Augustine and his seeking God in the depths of his being and finding a yearning restlessness about the encounter of God. Augustine made a lot of singing from the heart. He is attributed with the idea that to sing is to "pray twice." He also teaches that there is a form of singing that abandons all words and seeks to glorify God – a "contemplative" form of singing. In his commentary for Psalm 33 he says: "You must first understand that words cannot express the things that are sung by the heart. Take the case of people singing while harvesting in the fields or in the vineyards or when any other strenuous work is in progress. Although they begin by giving expression to their happiness in sung words, yet shortly there is a change. As if so happy that words can no longer express what they feel, they discard the restricting syllables. They burst out into a simple sound of joy, of jubilation. Such a cry of joy is a sound signifying that the heart is bringing to birth what it cannot utter in words.

Now, who is more worthy of such a cry of jubilation than God himself, whom all words fail to describe? If words will not serve, and yet you must not remain silent, what else can you do but cry out for joy? Your heart must rejoice beyond words, soaring into an immensity of gladness, unrestrained by syllabic bonds. Sing to him with jubilation."

And if we transcend the words and music of the chosen worship songs and hymns chosen this weekend for the "Songs of Praise" we may through the mystery of musical utterance join our voices here on earth with the eternal singing and musicmaking in heaven and in the process discover within ourselves a sense of unspeakable joy in seeking and resting in God.

Weekly Prayer

O God, the protector of all who trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: increase and multiply upon us your mercy; that with you as our ruler and guide we may so pass through things temporal that we lose not our hold on things eternal; grant this, heavenly Father, for our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.
